High School Update – The roof replacement work has gone out for bid. We're now waiting for the replies. It's expected that the contract will be awarded in July and the work to be completed no later than the end of December. Our President, **John Ekman**, applied for the next round of Commission for Cultural Center and Historic Preservation (CCCHP) grants and was awarded \$170K. This money will also be applied to the roof work.

It's not an easy task since several windows are missing and wind blows in a lot of sand. A lot of the windows have been repaired/replaced but we still have more to go. Thanks **Steve**

It has come to our attention that the Historical Society owns two lots in town – Block 94 Lots 19-20. There was quite a lot of discussion as to when and how much to ask for these lots. It's been pretty much decided that we'll sell the lots – just have to work out the details as to how to go about it.

Grants – The Goldfield Cemetery brochure is finished and all the paperwork completed. We're now just waiting for the reimbursement. This brochure will be put on our website in the future.

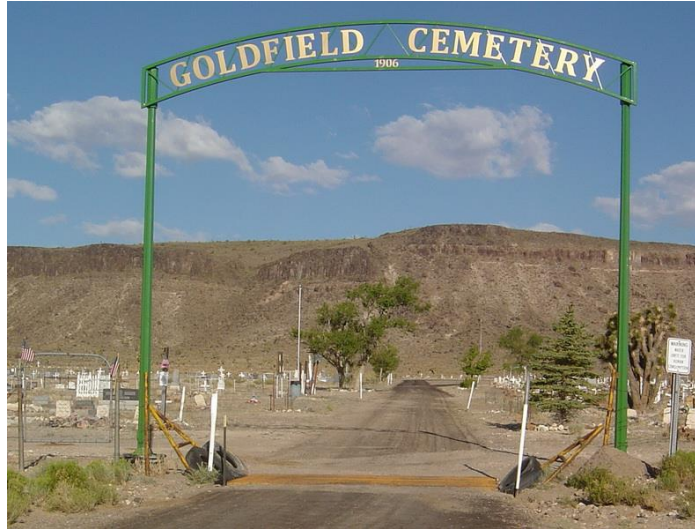
